

RACING FOR KIDS AND STAR MAZDA DRIVERS VISIT PRIMARY CHILDREN'S MEDICAL CENTER DURING MILLER MOTORSPORTS PARK RACE WEEKEND

Race drivers on the 2008 Star Mazda Championship presented by Goodyear circuit kicked off a five city, five race series of Racing for Kids Children's Hospital visits with a visit in May to Primary Children's Medical Center in Salt Lake City featuring drivers Chris Cummings of Vancouver, Canada and Billy Goshen of Brea, California.



Cumming (left), who drives the #16 World Speed Motorsports/Inviro Medical Mazda and Goshen (right), driver of the #83 Goshen Motorsports/Merv Griffin Entertainment Mazda, visited with 20-25 youngsters signing autographs and handing our Racing for Kids hats and other racing memorabilia. The duo also signed racing memorabilia for another 30 patients that will be distributed at a later date.

In the race, British driver Charles Hall (below left), survived a multi-car pile up at the start of the 45-minute race and took second in the

event and received a check for \$500 from Ron Hingst (right), Racing for Kids public relations director. Hall drives the #77 Andersen Racing/ Pardoes Solicitors/Allied Mazda. A check for \$500 also will be presented to Primary Children's Medical Center in Salt Lake City in Hall's name.

The Miller Motorsports Park event represented the first of five Star Mazda Championship races this year where drivers will make Racing for Kids Children's Hospital visits with a cash prize going to the top finishing RFK driver. Remaining Racing for Kids Star



Mazda races include Portland, New Jersey, Atlanta and Laguna Seca.

Charles Hall of Great Britain, who finished second in the Star Mazda Race at Miller Motorsports Park, was the top finishing Racing for Kids driver and won a \$500 cash prize from RFK.
