Louisiana's Alex Ardoin, the 2007 Star Mazda Racing for Kids Series' Award winner, took the RFK \$500 prize for the Quebec race by passing pole sitter Rusty Miller on the final lap to capture his first win of the year in the Star Mazda series. Dempsey (Joliet, IL) and Christodoulou (Salt Lake City) won the other two Racing for Kids Star Mazda races to date with two more remaining in Atlanta and Laguna Seca.
