All Children's shares its pediatric expertise through research and education affiliations with the University of South Florida (USF Health) as well as Moffitt Cancer Center, an NCI-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center.

Justin Wilson

Justin Wilson began racing as a teenager in England, becoming the first 16-year-old to win a British auto race. His career with the IZOD IndyCar Series began in 2008, where he finished 11th in the series for Newman/Haas/Lanigan Racing and won at The Raceway at Belle Isle in Detroit.

In 2009 he finished 9th in IndyCar Series standings for Dale Coyne Racing and gave them their first IndyCar Series victory at Watkins Glen. Also during 2009, Justin recorded three top-five and seventop-10 finishes. He led a total of 129 laps, including season-high 52 in finishing third at St. Petersburg.

Justin, who drives the #22 Z-Line Design car for Dreyer & Reinbold Racing this season, came in second in the Honda Grand Prix of St. Petersburg last year. He finished the 2010 IZOD IndyCar Series Championship in 11th place.

Connor DePhillippi

After winning many national karting championships, California native Connor DePhillippi switched to open-wheel racing in 2007 and won the Skip Barber Scholarship Shootout in 2008 with his prize being a full season of racing in the BF Goodrich Skip Barber National Series. He went on to win the Skip Barber championship in 2009 along with a full season of racing in the 2010 Star Mazda Championship, where he won both the final race of the season as well as the *Rookie of the Year* award, finishing third overall in the championship. For 2011 he has joined the new St. Petersburg-based Team Pelfrey, a competitive IZOD IndyCar team from 1998 – 200, which will field a two-car effort in the 2011 Star Mazda Championship presented by Goodyear for De Phillippi and teammate Nick Andries.
