Alton, VA (April 26, 2009) – As round two of the Star Mazda Championship presented by Goodyear commenced this afternoon, the four Kester Racing with Team 3G cars found themselves starting the race in four consecutive positions. The first lap saw a series of passing from all four of the drivers, but the overtaking was quickly followed by a series of unfortunate events. Several caution laps consumed the majority of the race placing J.C., Chris, and Taylor at the back. Kristy kept her racing momentum going until the end, gaining eight positions and finishing on the lead lap.

Kristy Kester, #48

Kristy on the race: "We did really well in practice and qualified with the fast group. In qualifying, we had brake issues which forced us to start at the rear. I had a great start in the race and passed six cars on the first lap. The race had a lot of yellow flags and restarts which were critical. Fortunately, I had a great restart, but I had trouble getting on the back straight. Overall, it was a good race for championship points. It wasn't the outcome I would have liked, but considering where we started, it was a decent finish."
