

Mosport is all about the fans. Wednesday night prior to the event people were already lining up to get into the track, and the place is packed Thursday through Sunday. With an average speed of 118 mph (190 kmh) there is little to no room for mistake. The track was drying quicker than we expected, and with a full rain set up on the car, I burned off the rain tires within just a few laps and would struggle the rest of the session.
