HOT ON THE HEELS OF A 3-RACE 'ROAD TRIP' – WITH ALL THREE RACES WON THE BY THE SAME DRIVER -- THE STAR MAZDA CHAMPIONSHIP PRESENTED BY GOODYEAR HEADS FOR ROUNDS 9 & 10 AT NEW JERSEY MOTORSPORTS PARK IN A HEATED BATTLE FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP

Heading into the home stretch of the 2008 season, the Star Mazda Championship presented by Goodyear is embroiled in a heated battle for the championship – just three points separate the top-3 drivers... and the top-10 are all within striking distance.

Irishman Peter Dempsey completed a 'Canadian hat trick,' winning Round 8 of the Star Mazda Championship presented by Goodyear at the Mobli1 Grand Prix of Mosport. Dempsey, driving the #21 Andersen Racing / LotusWorks/ Allied Building Products Mazda, also won the previous events at Trois Rivieres and Road America, becoming the first driver this season to win three races. Ron White, in 2006, was the last Star Mazda Championship driver to win three in a row.

Finishing second at Mosport was Joel Miller in the #20 JDC Motorsports / Mazda / K&N Air Filters Mazda, followed by Tom Gladdis in the #5 Andersen Racing / Marrache & Co. / Allied Building Products Mazda. The Expert Series winner was Chris Cumming, driver of the #16 World Speed Motorsports / Inviro Medical Mazda, while the Gerry Kraut, driving the #55 JDC Motorsports / Dougherty & Co. / Dougherty Funding LLC Mazda, won the Master Series class.

Rounding out the top-5 were pole-sitter John Edwards, who's #7 AIM Autosport Mazda seemed to have the measure of the field, but got caught out of position by the long final yellow, and Alex Ardoin, in a strong comeback after a massive shunt in qualifying destroyed his #51 Mundill Racing / Oral & Facial Surgery Center / Twister Trailer Mazda, forcing him to start in the team's backup car.

Heading into a double-header at the brand-new New Jersey Motorsports Park – rounds 9 & 10 of the 2008 Star Mazda Championship presented by Goodyear -- Joel Miller has re-acquired the lead in the championship – by the slimmest of margins -- with 274 points. Peter Dempsey is in

second with 273, followed by Alex Ardoin with 271, Charles Hall with 262, John Edwards with 252 and Tom Gladdis in 6th with 247 points.

On-track action at NJMP begins with a 'promoter test day' on Friday, September 12. There will be two official practice sessions on Saturday morning, September 13, with qualifying for Race 1 taking place from 1:00 pm to 1:45 pm Saturday afternoon. Teams and drivers will have less than two hours to make any final adjustments to the cars before the green flag waves for the first race at 3:30 pm Saturday afternoon. The Sunday schedule is slightly more benevolent, with the 45-minute qualifying session taking place from 9:20 am to 10:05 am and the race scheduled to start at 2:15 pm Sunday, September 14.

Race 1 / Round 9 will air on SPEED TV Sunday, October 5 at 2:00 pm (ET), while Race 2 / Round 10 will be broadcast Sunday, October 12 at 1:00 pm (ET).

Thunderbolt Raceway

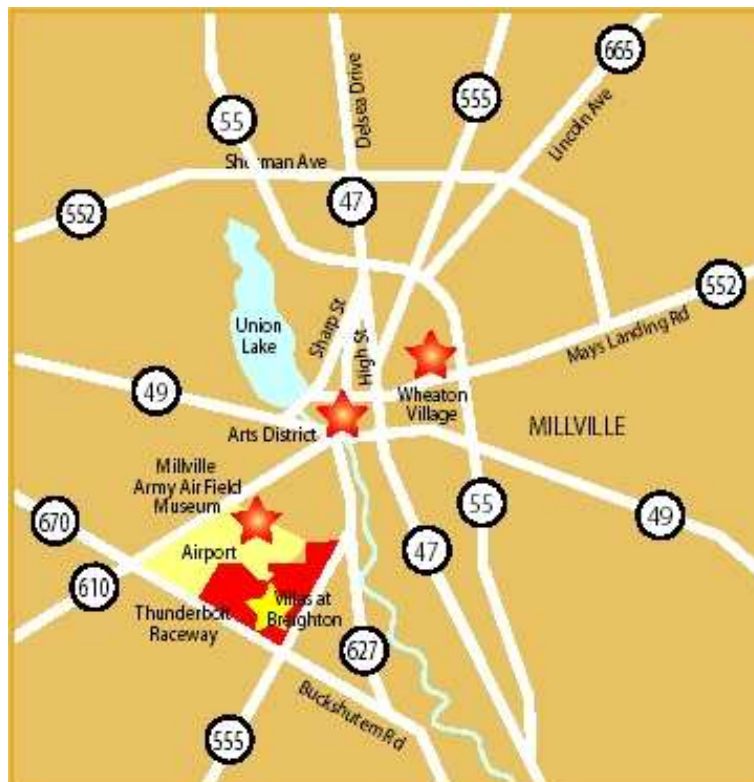

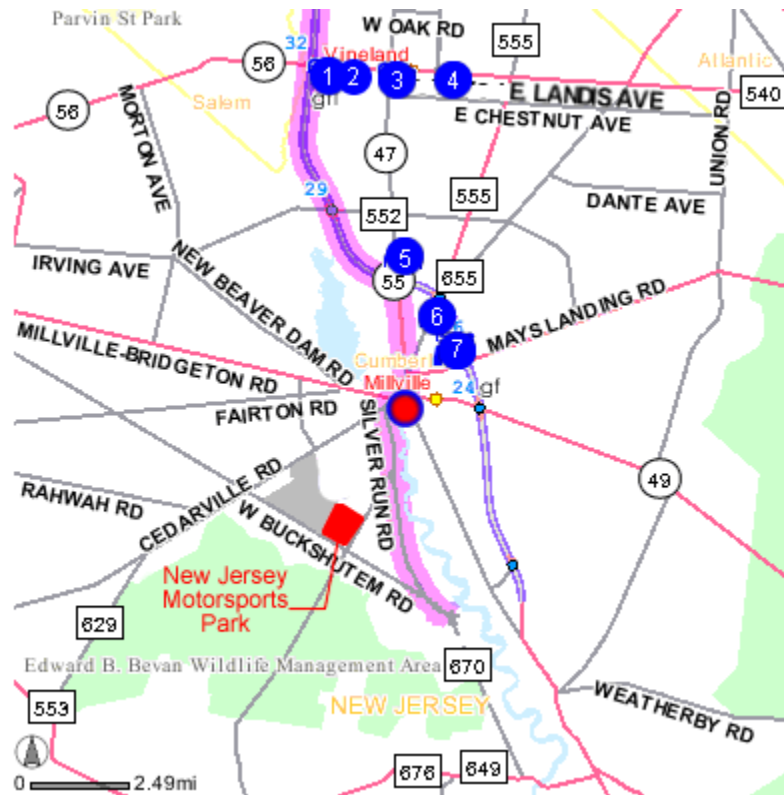

GLASSTOWN ARTS DISTRICT, Downtown Millville, New Jersey

You'll find 19th century buildings and homes of rich architectural history. There is a focus on fine arts at the Riverfront Renaissance Center for the Arts, a public gallery and education center. Wheaton Arts and Cultural Center

Located at Wade Boulevard and Village Drive in Millville. Only five miles from the New Jersey Motorsports Park.

WheatonArts is a national cultural treasure. Located on 65 wooded acres, WheatonArts is home to the Museum of American Glass, the Creative Glass Center of America International Fellowship Program, the largest folklife center in the Garden State, a hot glass studio, several traditional craft studios, five museum stores, a 13,000 sq. ft. event center and a beautiful pond-side picnic grove in a true Pineland Sanctuary! In addition to daily glass blowing and craft demonstrations, WheatonArts features special exhibitions, programs, workshops, performances and several weekend festivals throughout the year. WheatonArts offers an extraordinary level of personal interaction with professional artists in a warm and inviting environment.

Museum of American Glass

Museum of American Glass is at Wheaton Village. More than 6,500 objects span the history of American glass from the early 1700s to contemporary works. Exhibits include one of the largest bottles in the world as well as pieces by the Durand, Sandwich, and Tiffany glass companies, and by glass artists Dale Chihuly and Paul Stankard.

Millville Army Air Field Museum

Millville Army Air Field Museum is at 1 Leddon St. at the Millville Municipal Airport. Dedicated by the U.S. War Department in 1941, the Millville Army Air Field was known as “America’s First Defense Airport.” Some 100,000 men and women served in Millville during World War II, including 1,500 fighter pilots. Exhibits include aviation artifacts and displays dedicated to the Tusgee airmen, USO women and veterans of World Wars I and II, Korea and Vietnam.

Vineland Historical and Antiquarian Society

The Society has material relating to Vineland and its surroundings, including items belonging to town founder Charles K. Landis and his family. The museum features locally crafted glassware, military memorabilia, a music room, old firefighting equipment, American Indian relics, and period furniture and clothing.
